You qualify to participate if you are aged 18 or over and are eligible to vote in England, Scotland or Wales. If you consent to take part you will be asked a number of questions. The first part asks about how you view yourself. The second part asks for your views about a range of political, social and economic issues. Following this, you will be asked to provide some demographic data such as your age and gender. The whole task will take approximately 10 minutes.

The questions are straightforward and none of them are of an intimate nature. However, you may omit any questions which you do not wish to answer and can withdraw your participation at any point simply by exiting the survey/internet browser. We do not ask you to give your name or any other identifiable information.

You are free to withdraw yourself or your data from the study at any time you choose without needing to provide an explanation (see below for details). Your participation is completely voluntary and does not involve payment. Your responses will be kept securely and any identifiable data will be destroyed at the end of the study. All data kept in electronic format will be stored on a password-protected computer. The results of this research may be published or reported, but your name will not be associated in any way with the published results.

Thank you for taking the time to participate in this study. The research is looking at the relationship in Britain between personality (such as how extravert someone is) and attitudes towards a range of social, political and economic issues.

There is a lot of research about personality. There is a lot research about social, political and economic attitudes. There is quite a lot of research in the area of political psychology about how these fit together and there have been some interesting and replicated findings.

However, there are problems. Much of the existing work has been done in the USA or uses US data. It often involves certain assumptions: in particular the binary (Democratic/Republican) nature of US political

culture. By contrast, five parties received more than a million votes each in England at the 2015 UK general election and the situation in Scotland and Wales is even more complex. (Northern Ireland is outside the scope of this present research.) Similarly, issues are often prioritised in US-based research that are less topical in Britain: abortion and gun ownership/control being obvious examples.

Another problem is that the measures of attitudes used are often as contentious as they are conventional. In particular there is a tendency to use one-dimensional models such as "left versus right" or "liberal versus conservative". But a lot of theory and research since at least the 1960s has questioned whether these are valid.
