Who is doing the survey?

Ipsos MORI have been commissioned by the School of Psychology at Cardiff University to carry out this survey. Cardiff University are working in partnership with Nottingham University on the study.

The study is being led by Professor Nick Pidgeon, Dr Christina Demski, Dr Stuart Capstick and Dr Adam Corner (all of Cardiff University) and Dr Alexa Spence (Nottingham University). The study has been approved by the Ethics Committee of the School of Psychology at Cardiff University.

What is this survey about?

The survey considers the role of extreme weather as a critical influence on people's understanding of climate change. Although a number of studies have looked at how wider meteorological conditions (for example, day-to-day temperature) can affect people's views on climate change, there is little research that examines the role of extraordinary or extreme weather events in affecting public opinion. We are interested in this topic because there is reason to believe that extreme weather events may have a particularly pronounced effect on people's attitudes.

We are carrying out a large survey across Great Britain through which we can measure people's views about the flooding and about climate change, and how these are connected. We are collecting responses nationally and in specific flood-affected areas. This will enable us to compare affected regions with national data. For example, if people in flood-affected areas are more worried about climate change than the national sample, this might suggest that personal experience has had an effect on beliefs about climate change. Second, the survey will look more closely at a number of psychological factors which have been identified as important in shaping

people's views. These include the role of emotional responses (for example, anger about the flooding), different beliefs (for example, what people believe are the underlying causes of the flooding), and how 'distant' people feel from climate change as an issue.

How will my answers to the survey be used?

Your individual answers will remain anonymous and are only reported at the aggregate level. All data will be held totally anonymously, so that it is impossible to trace this information back to you individually. This information may be retained indefinitely.

Who is the survey for?
