- Risk (e.g. endorsement of the precautionary principle, ability to cope with unpredictable environmental change...)
- Costs (e.g. monitoring, de-designating sites, conduct new scientific research, costs to be paid by coastal communities and other stakeholders...)
- Time-scale (e.g. time required to set up the network, capability to adapt the network in the face of new information or environmental stressors...)
