However, to ensure complete protection of anonymity for any free-text answers, these responses are presented as stand-alone lists and are not included in the download of quantitative responses that is available, thus preventing them being linked to any other data.

Notes about the Athena Higher Education Survey Data

The ASSET online survey was developed in conjunction with the University of East Anglia as part of the Athena Project and was distributed by 42 UK universities to their academic and research staff working in science, medicine, engineering, technology and related subjects. Contract Research Staff were not the main target of this survey as that group had recently participated in the Contract Research Online Surveys (CROS) run by Bristol University for HEFCE. Thus the numbers in this staff group are disproportionately smaller than would be expected.

4,282 valid responses were received.

The survey was run initially in 2003 and repeated to a different group of institutions in 2004. A few questions were amended or introduced in 2004 and these changes are annotated.

All qualitative responses have been removed in compliance with the confidentiality statement given to respondents. In some cases qualitative responses had been categorised as part of the survey analysis, and the main categories have been included with the data set.
