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1. Information to the respondent

We are a partnership of Tanzanian and European research organisations. During 2015-2016, Tanzania experienced a particular climate event called the El Nino, which changes patterns of rainfall and of drought. We are studying the ways that the 2015-6 El Nino climate event has affected people's livelihoods. We also study the ways in which the management of natural resources and peoples' access to these resources during the El Nino event may have been affected by wildlife management areas (WMAs) through effects on availability and quality of water and land, grazing, fish, forest products and wildlife, opportunities for jobs and businesses, for example with tourism, and also on people's social and religious lives. We will work in WMA and non-WMA villages, because the comparison can help us understand the effects on people's climate coping strategies of different ways of managing natural resources.

We are inviting people in this and other villages to discuss the social and environmental effects of the changes in seasons, rainfall, drought or temperature experienced during 2015-6, and the ways in which WMAs may have helped or hindered coping strategies, so that the government and other organizations can understand better how these changes affect different people - men and women, better-off and poorer people, sedentary and migrating people, youth and older people.

For anyone who does talk with us, anything he or she says will be kept in complete confidence. If anyone agrees to talk with us and then changes their mind partway through, they can just say at any time that they want to stop and withdraw from the interview, without this being a problem for anyone. We take care to make sure that no one is put into difficulties as a result of this research. Copies of information about our research will be left in the WMA and village government offices, and anyone with questions or concerns can contact us or the funding agency, using the contact details we provide. At the end of the study we will share the main findings with the village.

We hope this study will make it easier for people to inform the government and NGOs about resource and management needs during extreme climate events, and more generally as climate and weather patterns change. We also hope to understand more about what works best for sustainable management of local natural resources. We hope that the findings we bring back to the village at the end of the study will help you in negotiating good outcomes with the government and with businessmen.

2. Basic household demographics

Note: Family arrangements vary across the different groups and sites in this survey. This must be considered when choosing whom to interview to represent the family. In the case of the Maasai, the family unit (Olmarei) may include a permanent homestead (Enkang) as a socially defined unit with several women's individual houses (aji); possibly linked with multiple satellite homesteads, possibly in urban or farming areas. In other tribes practicing polygamy, men may have several dispersed households including in neighbouring villages, managed more or less individually by the individual wives. In yet other cases a household may be female headed. To accommodate this diversity of arrangements we need to identify and interview the household head (whether male or female) as the primary decision maker for all interviews (for Maasai, this is the head of the Olmarei). When asking about assets we need to emphasize that this relates to the full number of individual households under the respective household head regardless of whether they are located together in a homestead or dispersed throughout the village or between several villages. This may mean asking first about what s/he has here and then asking whether s/he has another house / homestead elsewhere. However, if we ask about perceptions about changes in access or income this should reflect the respondents' personal perception. For activities conducted by women, such as collecting water, we use the women's questionnaire (if the household head permits).
