



Navigations of Toilet Access for Couriers and Food Delivery Riders

Take part in research

Are you currently working, or have recently worked, as a courier or food delivery rider? If so, I'd like to hear from you.

Despite an increase in mobile work, there has been a decline in the availability of public toilets. I am interested in speaking to courier and food delivery riders about their experiences of toilet access as part of their work. You must be 18+ years old to participate. All genders are welcome to participate. I'm particularly interested in hearing from people of all ethnic backgrounds, from workers who have migrated to the UK, and from those who have a longstanding health condition or disability.

Taking part will involve making audio or written commentaries of the times and places in which you access toilets as part of your work. There will also be an online or telephone interview. You can take part in both or just one of these options. Everything you share will be kept confidential. You will be given a £25 voucher for completing a diary and another £25 voucher for your participation in an interview as a thank you for your time.
